In early fall 1986, while doing a self-exam, Della felt a small lump in her right breast. At about the same time, her youngest sister, Irene (Rena) Offer, received a diagnosis of breast cancer in her left breast. They both underwent a biopsy to confirm the diagnosis. Rena had a radical mastectomy in September 1986 and followed up with chemotherapy and radiation treatment. As Rena left the hospital from her surgery, Della went into the hospital to have a radical mastectomy; however, Della did not require chemotherapy or radiation as the cancer was completely removed during the surgery. Della and Rena continued to support each other throughout their recovery, Della often attending appointments with Rena as she continued chemotherapy and radiation. The sisters shared holidays, laughter and the joyous occasion of seeing their daughters attend prom and graduate high school together in June 1987. As Rena continued to fight, the cancer spread to her lymph nodes and eventually to her brain. Della become her sister's caretaker throughout her fight with cancer – staying at Rena's home for weeks at a time to care for her. Oftentimes, Della was the only person Rena wanted around. Rena fought bravely for two years until she succumbed to cancer in August 1988 with Della and her family at her bedside. (continued)
